Level 2	Basic description of at least two points of view. OR Detailed comparison of two conflicting opinions. Comes to a basic conclusion but this may not be explained. Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.	4-7
Level 3	Complex comparison with multiple reasons for and against crossing the Great Plains, with clear reference to specific groups. Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion. Excellent SPaG with very few errors.	8-10
