Level 1	Describes reasons for it being Henry's fault OR reasons it was not. These may not be explained, just listed or mentioned. Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)	1-3
Level 2	Explains some reasons for it being Henry's fault OR reasons it was not. OR Describes both reasons for it being Henry's fault AND reasons it was not. Basic conclusion. Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.	4-7
Level 3	Complex explanations of both reasons for it being Henry's fault AND reasons it was not. Justified conclusion. Excellent SPaG with very few errors.	8-10
